Description

Anna Mark was born on October 28, 1920 at the Jewish Maternity Hospital and grew up on the Lower East Side of Manhattan. Her parents were Gittel (Gussie) and Jacob (Yankel) Mark, both immigrants from Poland. She graduated from Seward Park High School in 1938 and attended City College of New York for two years. From 1938 to 1942 she worked as a bookkeeper for Willie Rosehtahl, a moneylender located at 88 Ludlow Street. Mark began working at the Brooklyn Navy Yard in 1942 and worked there until 1947.

Anna Mark married Irving (Isadore) Goodman on April 20, 1947 at the Broadway Mansion and they honeymooned at the famous Catskill Nevele Hotel. They first lived at 55 Suffolk Street, a building that Irving and his father built, and later moved to 568 Grand Street. Irving was a veteran of World War II, serving in the Army during the Normandy campaign.
