From 1932 to 1946, he worked in the shop as a machinist, then shop planner, then supervisor machinist. From 1946 to 1966, he worked in the administration as an equipment specialist, then mechanical engineering technician, and later as a supervisory mechanical engineering technician. He attended several training courses for supervisory positions, saving the manuals and awards he received. Markowitz was terminated from his position when the Navy Yard closed in 1966. He died in Fort Lauderdale, Florida on January 9, 2000.
